

A Road Map MICHIGAN



Interstate highways are generally restricted access, which means that they do not include stoplights, but they may have an on or off ramp. An interstate highway is a restricted access highway that is designed for commerce and it includes no property entries, and interchanges at high velocity, ranging from 75 mph to 75 mph.

U.S. Highways generally allow for normal side road entry and they have regular stoplights. A U.S. highway is a complete access highway, similar to a main road and it includes houses, businesses, and direct junctions. The maximum permitted speed for a vehicle to run on a U.S. highway is 55 mph.
